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Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA)

The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) is the newest version of the 50 year old federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act and replaces the 2001 reauthorization known as No Child Left Behind. ESSA emphasizes equity and gives states and schools more latitude to innovate, while maintaining a focus on accountability and an emphasis on state and local systems of improvement.

- Improving Basic Programs for at-risk students in highest poverty schools.

Title II, Part A

- Improving Teacher Quality/Staff Development

Title III

- Language Instruction for Limited English Proficient and Immigrant Students

- McKinney-Vento Act, Homeless Liaison (.6 FTE)
