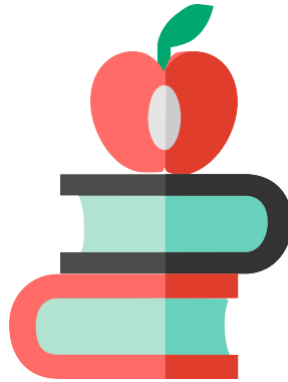


## What is Title I?

Title I is a federally funded program designed to provide help for students who are performing below grade level in reading and/or math.

The goal of the Title I program is to help students succeed academically and to reach grade level performance expectations by emphasizing high academic standards.



## Do all schools have a Title I Program?

Federal guidelines require that Title I programs are available in the district's schools with the highest level of low-income families.

According to federal guidelines, Crestview Elementary, Newport Elementary and Pullman Elementary schools qualify. Once a school qualifies for Title I, academic need (not socioeconomic status) determines which students receive additional instruction.

## Who qualifies for Title I services?

Title I students are students who will succeed when given additional instruction. The students are identified by their classroom teachers as needing additional help in reading and/or math based on their test scores and academic performance.

Those who show the greatest educational need and are not receiving special education services are served first.

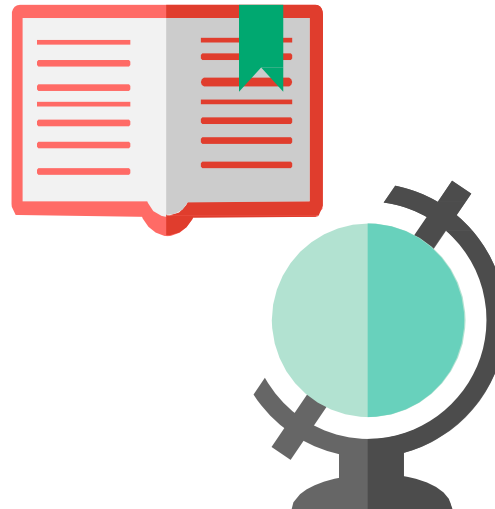


## What services do students receive as part of Title I?

Title I students work individually or in small groups with a teacher or a trained instructional assistant to master reading and/or math skills. Service is provided during the school day to support learning that is taking place in the regular classroom. Including support services for student and families experiencing homeless situations under McKinney-Vento legislation and foster-care students.

## How are parents involved?

- » Parents are notified of their child's eligibility for participation in Title I programs.
- » Parents and teachers sign an agreement explaining the program's goals and shared responsibilities.
- » Parents are provided with information about Title I services through newsletters and conferences with Title I staff.
- » Parents are encouraged to participate in monthly parent meetings.
- » Parents are encouraged to contact their school with Title I questions.
